What are the specifications for lawn maintenance for the City of Perry?

Grass, weeds or brush shall be cut, mowed and maintained as not to exceed the following height restrictions:

Residential Areas – Not to exceed eight inches (8")

Business and Industrial Areas - Not to exceed eight inches (8")

Agriculture Areas – Not to exceed fifteen inches (15")

Grass, weeds and brush which are allowed to grow in excess of the above specified limits will be deemed to be in violation of this ordinance.

Any property within the City of Perry, whether vacated or non-vacated, with grass, weeds or brush over the limits listed above on the first (1st) Wednesday of the month and the third (3rd) Wednesday of the month in the months of May, June, July, August, September and October, will be mowed by the City of Perry AND will be charged a fee. If payment is not received, the cost will be assessed to the property.

It is unlawful for any person to place grass or other yard waste in the street or alley.

What are the snow removal requirements for the City of Perry?

Property owners in residential districts must remove snow, ice, or accumulations within forty-eight (48) hours from when snow, ice or accumulations cease to fall.

Property owners in the business district must remove snow, ice or accumulations within twelve (12) hours from when snow, ice or accumulations cease to fall.

If the snow, ice or accumulation is not removed in the specified time, the City may clean the sidewalks and assess the costs against the property owners for collection in the same manner as property taxes.

What should I do if I have a complaint about grass/weeds, snow removal, junk vehicles, etc?

Is there anyone in Perry who performs salvage title vehicle inspections?

The Perry Police Department performs these inspections. The cost is \$30.00 per vehicle. Please call 515-465-4636 to schedule an inspection.

What are the height regulations for trees over streets, sidewalks, and alleyways?

All trees, whether being private or public, must be trimmed to at least 9 feet above all sidewalks and at least 13 feet above all streets and alleyways.
